This tour will explore the beautifully landscaped rural cemetery movement cemetery from the 1840's and will include stops at the Gardner Earl Chapel and Crematorium as well as the gravesites of Emma Willard, "Uncle Sam" Wilson, General Wool and the Tayloe and Warren families.



The tour will continue to the downtown Troy historic district where the walking tour will concentrate on the Women of Second Street and their contributions in the field of education, abolition and the suffrage and anti-suffrage movements. The tour will be led by Bernie Vogel, Administrator for Oakwood Cemetery and Kathryn Sheehan, Registrar at the Rensselaer County Historical Society and Rensselaer County Historian.

Please wear comfortable shoes. Although downtown Troy is flat, we will encounter some low hills in the cemetery. Please note transportation will be on your own. Car pools will be available for those without cars.
