ADOPT-A-SHELF PROGRAM AT WADSWORTH LIBRARY

In August, 2011 I initiated an Adopt-a-Shelf volunteer program at the Wadsworth Library in Geneseo, NY. This program enlists


volunteers who are assigned a shelf (or shelves) and then, on a regular basis, come to the library and shelf read their adopted sections. The call for volunteers went out to members of the library's Friends group and patrons who use the library regularly. The response was amazing, and within a few weeks all sections of the library were adopted and put in order.

This program required a fair amount of time initially, but now all the paperwork and volunteers are in place it works very easily. When volunteers first adopt a shelf, they are trained on the correct procedures. After they read and straighten their section the first time, they are checked for accuracy. Volunteers come at their convenience but are asked to read their shelves at least once every two weeks. After they have read their shelves, they sign a log with their name, date, section, and the number of minutes it took them. I then enter all of this information into an Excel spread sheet.

The spread sheet helps me keep track of the number of volunteer hours. It also helps me oversee which sections are being read regularly and those that are not. If for any reason a section is no longer being attended, it is placed up for adoption again.

The collection is now in the best order it has ever been, and it has had a tremendous impact on our ability to find what we're looking for. Our daily pull sheets are done within minutes with no more searching for titles that are out of place. The volunteers take great pride in making their sections look neat and tidy. Some are even complaining they no longer have to move anything around because the shelves are already in order. They think it is boring! But this makes me very happy.

As I write this, I have 76 wonderful volunteers who have logged a total of more than 120 hours of shelf reading and straightening the collection. Thanks to the volunteers, these are 120 hours where we've been able to work on other tasks. The Wadsworth Library has never looked better, and I am very proud of the volunteers who have helped to make it happen.
