Cancer and Blankets...

I am now 57 years old, yes admitting to my age. I never thought I would be using my own name and the word "cancer" in the same sentence. Each of us has known someone who has had cancer and I believe these instances increase the older we get. It was shocking to me when I was diagnosed with Kidney Cancer (more specifically, Renal Cell Carcinoma) in September of 2012. I was then scheduled for many tests and scans and given a surgery date of September 24, 2012. My mind



was reeling with all of the vocabulary and medical lingo I was now hearing... all related to me and my health. It was frightening and overwhelming. I went into St. Lukes Cornwall Hospital for my pre-op testing and was wheeled all over the hospital meeting techs and nursing staff in every area I went.

After one particular challenging (I am very claustrophobic...) full body scan, I met a lovely nurse. She asked me if I was cold, I had been shaking a bit. She brought me over a blanket and told me that this blanket was special and she wanted to give it to me to take home for after my hospital stay. I realized, after really looking at this blanket, that it was for a young person...it was a High School Musical themed blanket. I was amused and grateful but told her that this was for a young child who may need this more than myself. She insisted that I keep this and told me the hospital had many more to give to ill children. I was hesitant but realized that for right now, it served me well, I was still shaking. After my surgery, my wonderful surgeon took out my right kidney and some lymph nodes for testing, I kept that blanket and brought it home.

I am now cancer-free and have been on a clinical trial for stage 3 kidney cancer patients with Memorial Sloan Kettering in NYC. The drug I was given for this trial was only given to me for that first year out and so far, no cancer has returned, thank God! Speaking of God, my faith in Him grew during this time. I depended on Him. My colleagues at Newburgh Free Library, my friends and neighbors, my pup Peanut and my family

all helped me through this time (my husband lost his job just months before my diagnosis and was able to be with me through every step of this journey). I am blessed and one of the symbols of this blessing in my life is the blanket I received during the most stressful time of my life.

I encourage all out there in Library Land who will, to keep making blankets...blankets of ALL styles and handiwork. You never know what kind of an impact you can make in someone's life during the most stressful and even lonely periods in their lives. You can bring peace, love and comfort to someone who really needs that. I may never know WHO made my own blanket but can tell you that I still am loving this gift that I received in my life. Thank you all for listening and keep up the good work!

John Fisher & Thomas More ~ Martyrs of Religious Freedom

What began as a severed head turned into a compelling history lesson on Thomas More, John Fisher, and the tumultuous times of Tudor England.

In March 2016, Irish actor Bosco Hogan, who is best known for his portrayal of John Fisher on the Showtime series, "The Tudors," spent a week at St. John Fisher College in Rochester, NY. Hogan, invited to campus by Philosophy professor, Dr. Tim Madigan, performed his one-man show, "I am Ireland: An Entertainment of W.B. Yeats" and shared his experiences playing Bishop Fisher.

At the conclusion of his visit, Bosco Hogan presented Professor Madigan with a unique gift – the authentic prop



head used to film the beheading scene. The head is now an artifact in the permanent collection of the St. John Fisher College Archives. The head, with all its lovely gore, became an inspiration for a display.

In 1534, both Sir Thomas More & Bishop John Fisher refused to sign the oath in the Act of Succession. The Act required all those asked to take the oath to recognize Anne Boleyn as King Henry VIII's lawful wife and their children legitimate heirs to the throne. Anyone refusing to take the oath was guilty of treason.

They were convicted of treason and imprisoned in the Tower of London. In June and July of 1535, they were both executed by beheading. Four hundred years after their deaths, they were canonized by Pope Pius XI, May 19, 1935.

Continuing Education Scholarship

To qualify for the NYSLAA Continuing Education Scholarship, you must be:

- Continuing your professional development in a non-matriculated program

To apply for a scholarship, submit the following to the NYSLAA President:

- •A completed form found at nyslaa.org
- A written statement of 150 to 300 words explaining your goals and how this scholarship will aid you
- A letter from the Registrar's office or a receipt that you are enrolled
- Course cost verification

Applications must be sent to Michele Matthews at **prendm@rpi.edu** and postmarked no later than December 31, 2016.

First consideration will be given to applicants who have not received a NYSLAA scholarship in the past.

The Degree Program Scholarship

NYSLAA will award one scholarship in the amount of \$350.

To qualify for the NYSLAA Degree Program Scholarship, you must be:

- A regular member of NYSLAA for at least two years
- Actively pursuing a matriculated degree at an accredited educational institution

To apply for a scholarship, submit the following to the NYSLAA President:

- •A completed application form found at nyslaa.org
- •A written statement of 150 to 300 words explaining your goals and how this scholarship will aid you
- A copy of your transcript or letter from the Registrar's office citing the number of credit hours taken

Please note:

Applications must be sent to Michele Matthews at **prendm@rpi.edu** and postmarked no later than December 31, 2016.

Applicants may receive the Degree scholarship only once. Previous winners may not apply.
