


We would also like to encourage everyone to consider

Rochester's Giant Read

Friday morning October 20, library staff members **Terry Berl**, Adrianna Barone (Terry's granddaughter) Laura Emerson and Jennifer Kegler along with 30 athletes



of various sports at The College at Brockport traveled to Rochester City School No. 43 as part of the READ program. Originally started in 2011, local colleges collaborate with the Rochester City School District to bring collegiate student-

athletes together with elementary school children. This program was initially funded by a grant which has since been eliminated. However, the impact this program has had was too valuable for it not to continue.

The library staff graciously donated a copy of "Pete the Cat and the Treasure Map" for each student in the

second grade. The "Friends of the Library" purchased enough new drawstring book bags to continue this program through the next four years. Each student receives a drawstring backpack that includes a copy of "Pete the Cat and the Treasure Map", a bookmark,



crayons, composition notebook and writing utensils donated by Drake Memorial Library. The local dental office of Stephen Weinstein donated toothbrushes, dental floss and toothpaste for the second graders.

The morning started in three classrooms where the Brockport student-athletes joined the children to read "Pete the Cat and the Treasure Map" together. Later, all the classes assembled in the gym for physical activity. The children played basketball, climbed the rock wall, jumped rope and had scooter rides with their new friends. The highlight of the morning was when Ellsworth (The College at Brockport mascot) arrived and interacted with the children. Ellsworth is always a big hit; he gets the second graders excited about reading.





Family Literacy Program

Drake Memorial Library at The College at Brockport has been in the midst of a Collection Evaluation Project. Recent changes in personnel brought about focus on the library's Juvenile Collection. **Terry Berl** is committed



to Literacy Programming. She experiences firsthand the excitement that the gift of a book can bring to a child through her coordination and participation in the Giant Read program every year.

Through the Giant Read program, local colleges collaborate with the Rochester City School District to bring student-athletes together with elementary school children. As a member of the NYSLAA Donation Committee and the NYSLAA 2018 Conference Committee, Terry was aware that this year Family Literacy Services Red Bookshelf through ProAction of Steuben and Yates, Inc. is one of the 2018 conference's community outreach recipients. The

75 Red bookshelves places in public throughout Steuben Yates Counties and provide free children's books to anyone in the community. Terry saw an opportunity to help this cause. Drake



Memorial Library's Juvenile Librarian and Collection Management Librarian enthusiastically agreed to donate the deselected material to the Red Book Shelf. Terry sorted through thousands of withdrawn books from the library's Juvenile collection and selected 1263 of them to donate to the Red Bookshelf. After reaching out to Linda George (Family Literacy coordinator) Terry boxed, labeled and personally delivered the



books to the Red Bookshelf warehouse location in Bath, NY to meet with Linda. The Family Literacy Program was very grateful for the truckload of donated books.

Fisher Fridays

What started as a fun workplace incentive turned into an amazing philanthropic venture.

In the summer of 2012, someone suggested starting "Fisher Fridays", a day where all the employees in Lavery Library at St. John Fisher College could dress down in their Fisher gear for the day. Employees who



wanted to participate were asked to donate \$1.00 for the honor of dressing down. Before we knew it, we had collected quite a bit of cash. So, unanimously it was decided that we would donate to a local charity. That summer we were able to donate \$150.00 to the Town of Irondequoit's Community Food Cupboard. Since then, Lavery Library has donated over \$3600 to 32 charities. Some charities held a personal connection, like our donation to Pancreatic Cancer to honor one of our Deans who lost his battle to that disease or showing support to one of our student worker's participation in the annual Relay for Life walk.
