As the Covid-19 situation has continued, we have deemed it prudent to cancel this year's NYSLAA conference.



Virtual Animal Assisted Activities

The Ithaca College Library's Animal Assisted Activities have been an important de-stress component of the library's final study break activities since 2015. The animal visits typically consist of a few different dogs, often a Shih Tzu named Max, and "Breakfast" the llama, a student favorite. These events help to create fun breaks from studying, but they are also community bonding experiences at the end of a semester. With the pandemic, Ithaca College transitioned to online learning in March. Providing students with de-stress opportunities and feeling connected to the college as they finish their finals on Zoom are more relevant than ever. This encouraged us to create virtual animal assisted activities.

Animal Animations

Some questions that needed an answer were: how would we create a virtual animal visit and how would we promote it. An email to the Cornell Companion volunteers provided us with many volunteer photos; even some animals that have not visited us (yet) in person. We chose to make a video using either Windows video editor or the Mac iMovie app. Both of these apps allow the user to quickly drag and drop photos, include features like editing photo transitions, and finish it off with music. We had hoped to give a presentation on Animal Assisted Activities this year at the NYSLAA conference, which has been postponed to June 2021. We hope to see you all there and may have information to share on two new animal visitors that will soon be in training, Anniversary the Alpaca and Curley the Camel. See you in 2021!
