

2021 NYSLAA CONFERENCE

Our 42nd conference date is tentatively set for June 9-11, 2021 at the State University of New York College of Agriculture and Technology in Cobleskill, NY. All the same speakers have agreed to present their workshops in 2021. Some of the workshops might be limited due to covid social distancing regulations. As with everything else, it is in flux and we will let you know as things become clearer. The decision to move forward with the conference planning and execution will depend on the decisions made by both the governor and SUNY Cobleskill. The decision will not be made until, at least, the beginning of next year. So please stay tuned to the listsery, Facebook, the NYSLAA website, and the newsletter. We will update you as information becomes available.

While we wait, let me refresh your minds on what you can expect from the 2021 conference!

Plan on coming in early on Wednesday and participating in an afternoon tour. We are hopeful that the various venues will be able to accommodate us and we will be contacting them as we firm up plans. We have three great options! There will be a 90-minute tour of Howe Caverns, a one hour guided tour of the Iroquois Indian Museum or a 90-minute guided campus tour. Then Wednesday night will be our Meet and Greet complete with a chicken barbeque dinner, cash bar, and weather permitting, a campfire with s'mores right at the Alumni Commons where we will be staying.

Some of the workshops for Thursday are The Science of Sound, Meditation, Crystals, and Stress Relief; two hands-on computer skills classes; and Universal Design.


Additionally, the library sustainability committee is
