Start thinking about donating a basket to the 2024 conference.




# **Membership Secretary**

Our conference starts on Wednesday, June 7 with a choice of tours and our Meet & Greet Dinner. This year the Meet & Greet dinner cost is included in the registration fee.

Please consider joining us for a tour of either Kykuit, the historic Rockefeller Estate or the Percy Grainger Home and Studio.

At Kykuit you will see a Classical Revival-style villa that was completed in 1913 for John D. Rockefeller, founder of the Standard Oil Company. Four generations of Rockefellers lived in this house. Including Nelson A. Rockefeller, four-time governor of New York and vice president under Gerald Ford. There is an art gallery which includes works by Andy Warhol and Alexander Calder. The grounds feature formal gardens in a variety of styles and contains fountains, pavilions, and Nelson Rockefeller's collection of large-scale sculptures, including works by Louise Nevelson, David Smith, Pablo Picasso, and Henry Moore.





The Percy Grainger Home and Studio you will see is an American four-square wood shingled house. It is the resource most significantly associated with Grainger in America. Percy Grainger, born in Australia in 1882, was a renowned composer and pianist, a writer and watercolorist, a clothing designer and pioneering collector of folk songs. For forty years, from 1921 until his death in 1961, Grainger occupied the house at 7 Cromwell Place, White Plains, using it for his residence, practice studio, and laboratory for his avant-garde musical compositions and experimental music machines. The Grainger Home and Studio remains today furnished as it was during Grainger's lifetime, a dramatic living testimony to the life and times of a multi-faceted genius.

# **Craig Koste Award for Outstanding Service**

In 1992 the Executive Council created "The NYSLAA Award for Outstanding Service" specifically for New York State library assistants who are members of NYSLAA. In 1995, its name was changed to honor Craig Koste, a library assistant who passed away and bequeathed an endowment to NYSLAA. The award recognizes those library assistants who have distinguished themselves by their service to our organization and to the library assistants of New York on either a state or local level. A stipend of \$100 will be given to the library of the winner for collection development.

# Ray Murray Award

In 1989 the Ray Murray Award was created to honor Ray Murray, a librarian who opened the door for the creating of the annual library assistants conference, thereby laying the groundwork for NYSLAA. The Ray Murray Award is given to librarians, library directors, trustees, board members or others who have contributed to the recognition and/or professional growth of library assistants.

# **Craig Koste & Ray Murray Award Nomination Process**

Each year, NYSLAA seeks nominations from its members for each of these awards. The Executive Council reviews the nominations in April of each year and notifies the recipients. The awards are presented at the annual conference in June.
